Landscape Value:

A wonderful disease resistant, winter hardy rose in Iowa.

This 3’-5’ shrub rose is a great addition to the landscape.

Flowers have a heavy bloom in early summer and bloom sporadically throughout the growing season.

Notes:

This is the most popular rose bred by Dr. Griffith J. Buck at Iowa State University. His roses are known to be naturally disease-resistant (although in wet years, even resistant roses get black spot) and winter hardy. Carefree Beauty rose can truly be considered carefree in the Iowa landscape!

This rose is also a parent to the current most popular rose in the nursery industry—Knock Out (Rosa ‘Radrazz’)
